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### Radical Rebellion

So, we are told by some Christians who are 'deconstructing' that we are too tied to our traditions, and that we should break loose from our tired religion and practice what some call 'radical Christianity'.

And, depending on how we define those terms, I would tend to agree.

Zerubbabel, Ezra, and Nehemiah had to deconstruct a thousand years of tradition to restore the ancient religion of Israel. And after the Pharisees made a mess of things, Jesus had to deconstruct the deconstructed religion. It is notable that He never condemned their strict observance of the Law, but their hypocrisy in the doing of it (Mt

23:23) and their elevation of human tradition above God's Law (15:3). And His work and message were certainly radical by any standard.

Today, faithful preachers continue to rebuke hypocrisy among God's people and the tendency of some to elevate 'the way we've always done it' to the status of scripture. They preach the doing of it, not just the talking about it. And they fearlessly draw the lines where God has drawn them — which today is much more radical than 'coming out' and declaring one's freedom from the law of Christ. Remember, grace covers a multitude of sins, but not unrepented rebellion (He 6:4-6).
