Godly Judgment

Past generations' most quoted verse in the Bible was John 3:16. The most quoted verse of my generation will be Matthew 7:1, "Judge not, that you be not judged." Of course, as past generations treated John 3:16, context will be considered optional.

Jesus plainly taught that the real problem with judgment is when it is done in hypocrisy! "First remove the plank from your own eye, and then you will see clearly to remove the speck from your brother's eye" (Mt. 7:5). Personally, I don't really want anyone touching my eyeballs, but certainly not someone who can't see what they are doing!

Jesus rhetorically asked His disciples, "Can the blind lead the blind? Will they not both fall into a pit?" (Lk. 6:39). If we are to make judgments and lead people to Christ, we must have clear vision ourselves!

This requires us to live in such a way that we can be considered blameless. The problem with hypocritical judgment is that it can be given right back to the one who dishes it out. "With what judgment you judge, you will be judged; and with the measure you use, it will be measured back to you" (Mt. 7:2).

As Christians, our reputations matter in this world because of the name we wear — we are representing Christ! "Do all things without complaining and disputing *that you may become blameless* and innocent... in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, *among whom you shine as lights in the world*" (Ph. 3:14-15).

Contrary to worldly preference, godly judgment requires a spiritual mindset (1 Co. 2:15). However, we must take great care to never play the hypocrite, and to ensure that we make our judgments in a loving way.
