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# The Serious Subject of Salvation

You and I will be dead one day soon – and while it may not be the most pleasant thing to think about it, it is certainly the most important.

Thinking about where we will be, not just ten years from now but ten thousand years from now, helps to put our lives in perspective. It reminds us to make the important thing the important thing.

And what is the 'important thing'? Jesus clarifies, "What will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his soul?" (Mt 16:26).

Your soul is your most valuable possession. That's the reason salva-

tion is a serious subject. Your doctor can save you from serious illness – for a while. Your financial advisor can save your portfolio so that you can enjoy the fruits of your labor – for a while.

But only Jesus can save your soul – your most valuable possession.

Why then do so many ignore Him? That's easy – they simply don't believe. They don't believe that death is an imminent concern. Or they don't believe that eternity is that demanding – after all, they are a 'good person' and all 'good people' go to heaven. Or they may not even

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believe they have a soul. They believe they are nothing more than a highly evolved creature who will cease to exist when they draw their last breath.

But the Bible puts the lie to all such popular delusions. For example, we simply do not know how imminent our death is (Lu 12:20). And eternity is more demanding than many realize (Mt 7:13-14). And yes, you are the product of an Intelligent Designer, created in His image (Ge 1:27). To believe otherwise is to be a fool (Ps 14:1, lifeless matter created intelligent life? We are supposed to believe **that**?).

The approach which makes the most sense – the one advocated by Jesus – is to take our soul, and its salvation, seriously. This does not mean that we must become a cloistered ascetic, or a theologian, or a 'holier-than-thou' religious zealot (thank goodness!).

But what it does mean is that we must realize our moral obligation to a good and benevolent Creator - a God so perfect that He will not

condone or fellowship our sinful behavior; a God so loving that He gave Himself to die for our sins; and a God so powerful that He holds our fate in His own hands.

Our obligation to this God is that we come to Him on His terms, seeking forgiveness through the blood of Jesus, and then to walk humbly with Him for the remainder of our days – until our time on this earth is done.

That walk is characterized by the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control (Ga 5:22-23). It is not always easy; but it is easier than dy-ing unprepared to meet our God.

So, if you have not taken the subject of your soul's salvation seriously to this point in your life, please think seriously about taking it seriously **now**. Whether have never been a Christian, or whether you have been just been 'playing church', now is the time to make the important thing the important thing!

So, I go to the Old Bible to find how they fought. I find David, a young shepherd boy, going out with a sling to fight a giant ten feet tall, and killing him. I then turn and watch Samson with the jawbone of an ass fighting and killing a thousand men on the other side...

If I should pass your home late at night and saw fire breaking through the roof of your house, would I be your friend if I should let you alone?...
