Whose Kids Are These?

It's a question one might hear in a store when some ill-trained urchins are tearing up the place. But it's also a question receiving attention in the current political arena — do your kids belong to you, or do they belong to the community? It's an interesting question — and one with a Biblical answer.

Of course, it's a question that has been around for a while. As one author noted, "Leonid Sabsovich, the leading Soviet urban planner under Lenin and Stalin... argued for a total separation of children from parents starting in the earliest years of child development" (Paul Kengor, The Federalist).

In Geore Orwell's book, 1984, and again in his *Animal Farm*, Orwell warned about such dystopian behavior – kids being removed from their parents at a very young age to be raised by the state.

More recently, writers have continued the theme. "Giving total control [to parents] over the minds and bodies of minors blows past creepy..." (Amanda Marcotte, Slate). And again, "...we have to break through our kind of private idea that kids belong to their parents, or kids belong to their families, and recognize that kids belong to whole communities" (Melissa Harris Perry, MSNBC). As one governor put it, "I don't think parents should be telling schools what they should teach."

Not that we are particularly concerned about the politics of it all; but we **are** concerned about what God's Word says about kids – 'whose kids these are' and what the responsibilities of godly parents are in the education of their kids.

Jacob understood that his children were given to him by God (Ge 33:5). Joseph understood the same thing (Ge 48:9). Isaiah wrote, "Behold, I and the children whom the LORD has given me..." (Isa 8:18). But the Psalmist says it best: "Behold, children are a heritage from the LORD; the fruit of the womb is a reward" (Ps 127:3).

This does not mean that children are mere chattel – that they can be bought and sold like common property. But it **does** mean that parents are stewards of their children – and only for a brief time at that. And with that stewardship comes heavy responsibility.

Under the Mosaic Law, parents were charged: "teach [God's Law] diligently to your children" (De 6:7). Under the gospel, parents have a similar charge: "bring [your children] up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord" (Ep 6:4). Some may call this 'propaganda'. But note that those who make such an accusation are themselves seeking to propagandize your children in the ways of the world – ways too numerous to itemize here.

So, whose kids are these? They are **yours**, mom and dad. Don't let anyone tell you otherwise. - *WKing*

Yes, the media are very cranky that a Catholic family man who seems serious about his Christian beliefs is now Premier of New South Wales. Yes, they are demonizing him and undermining him. No, it won't stop, so long as he stands firm.

We are not of this world. We are of Him, whom the world rejected. And in that, there are great costs. But there is real joy, and greatest reward. "Well done, good and faithful servant."
