# Light and Life

### I, Barabbas

Caiaphas and the other Jewish leaders marched Jesus to the Praetorium early one morning to be judged by Pilate. Pilate told the Jews, "You take Him and judge Him according to your law" (Jn 18:31). He didn't want to touch what he saw as Jewish infighting that the Sanhedrin wished to end with the death of an innocent Man. After a short interrogation, Pilate confirmed that there was no legal reason for Jesus to die. He went out to the angry mob and told them, "I find no fault in Him at all" (Jn 18:38).

Seeking a way to avoid bloodshed, Pilate remembered a custom he could leverage. "You have a custom that I should release someone to you at the Passover. Do you therefore want me to release to you the King of the Jews?" (Jn. 18:39). Surely this was the perfect solution! Who better to fulfill this custom and be released without harm than a Man who had been judged innocent?

"Then they all cried again, saying, 'Not this Man, but Barabbas!" (Jn 18:40). The Scriptures describe Barabbas as a robber, a murderer, a rebel, and a notorious prisoner. What level of hate the Jewish people must have had for them to ask that this man be released to them rather than the Innocent Lamb of God!

And yet, this is a perfect picture of the gospel. The wage of Barabbas' crimes was death; but instead of him being on that cross, it was Jesus! Is this not a physical representation of my relationship to Jesus? The wage of my sin is death, and yet Christ became the propitiation for my sins (1 Jn 2:2). What a realization to read the story of my Lord's crucifixion and see that in many ways I am Barabbas!

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### Can Eternal Life Be Lost?

You may have heard the question, "How can a Christian lose eternal life, since it is eternal?" It's a good question – and deserves a response.

On the one hand, numerous passages warn us of the possibility of apostasy. From Jesus' parable of the sower (Mt 13:20-22) to the letters of Paul (1 Co 9:27, Ga 5:4), to the writings of Peter (2 Pe 2:20-22), to the entire book of Hebrews – God's children are admonished about the real possibility of falling away. Such passages cannot simply be ignored.

But what about passages like Jn 6:54 (and others) which describe eternal life as a present possession?

First, eternal life is not just eternal existence. Even the lost will exist eternally (Mt 25:46). Rather, Jesus defined eternal life as a relationship: "This is eternal life, that they may know You, the only God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent" (Jn 17:3). And yes, relationships can be broken – we can just walk away.

Which is also what Jesus taught in John 10:27-28. The "sheep" of this passage are those who "hear" Him and "follow" Him; continual action verbs which define the relationship. No outside forces can sever that bond; but sadly we can, if we choose to stop following Him.
