# What Exalts A Nation?

The lesser of two evils cannot exalt a nation – only righteousness can do that (Pr. 14:34)! Likewise, public policy is not the problem our nation faces. Disgraceful policy is just a symptom of a nation full of sinful hearts (Pr. 14:34)!

The answers to our problems cannot be found in the philosophies of man, but only in the plan of God. God's plan cannot be enacted man's way! It must be done God's way. King Josiah did his best to legislate morality (II Ch. 34:33), but when he eventually put politics over God and died (35:20-24), the people went right back to their wickedness! It is not only good actions that matter, but even the motivation behind them.

Even if there is a candidate that can be considered righteous, like Josiah, faith in him is vain! "Do not put your trust in princes, nor in a son of man in whom there is no help. His spirit departs, he returns to his earth; in that very day his plans perish. Happy is he who has the God of Jacob for his help, whose hope is in the Lord his God" (Ps. 146:3-5)! When we adopt a spiritual worldview, it seems foolish to spend time investing in a man whose work will all be undone shortly after he leaves office. Rather, we should invest in the kingdom of which we are a part in Christ (Ph. 3:20)!

Throughout the Bible, bad rulers were clearly described as punishment for the overall wickedness of a nation (I Sam. 8; Hb. 1:6; Jer. 51:20-23; Isa. 10:5-7). When governments are oppressive, it is not the Republicans or the Democrats who are to blame – it is sin! And the solution is not a worldly political activism – it is evangelism!

"...if my people who are called by My name will humble themselves, and pray and seek My face, and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin and heal their land" (II Chr. 7:14).

# Who Cares? So What?

Is there a 'right' and 'wrong'? Is there 'truth' beyond which is 'error'? Is there a standard by which such is established? We discourage a hasty answer and suggest some careful soul-searching before you commit yourself to something you do not really believe, for the consequences are tremendous.

There is the choice between man as his own final authority, and God – his Maker and Superior. At this point it is important to recognize that if God is the final authority, a revelation of 'truth and right' cannot be subject to man's feelings or approval. It must be approached objectively. And we may safely assume that God would make His will understandable to His creatures.

Then, there is the choice between man as a robot – his will, words, and actions predetermined, or man as a free moral agent. Walk with care! For with free will there is responsibility, and there must be final judgment. Ability, responsibility, and accountability – these are inseparable concepts. Even if God is removed from the scene, man must respond and give account of that response to his fellow man, and to himself. Failing this, his existence is utterly without meaning. Put God into the scene – you can't keep Him out – and responsibility becomes awesome.

Not impossible, for responsibility is linked with ability. Not terrifying, for the 'fear' of God is reverence for a loving Father – but awesome nonetheless. Its burden is cushioned by the 'good news' of His love, mercy, and sacrifice on our behalf – and by "the recompense of the reward."

We can ill afford the popular "Who Cares?" or "So What?" attitude. Nor can we afford an emotional 'love' to blind us to the realities of divine authority. It is a false peace that ignores one's need to know – and follow – the word of God.

# Responding to the Revolution
